Superior Court Criminal Caseload Form
Calendar Year 2009

Please report the criminal filings from calendar year 2009

- By docket (indictments or accusations)
- By defendant (there may be one or multiple)

Unified Appeals (if available) The District Attorney will also be asked to report any unified appeals filed within the calendar year being collected.

Serious Felonies – a serious felony docket consists of any charge with a mandatory minimum sentence of ten years or more. *A case filed with one serious felony charge and multiple felony charges should be counted as (1) serious felony docket.*

§ 17-10-7	Punishment of repeat offenders; punishment and eligibility for parole of persons convicted of fourth felony offense
§ 17-10-16	Sentence to imprisonment for life without parole authorized; ineligibility for parole or leave programs
§ 16-4-10 (a)(1)	Domestic terrorism intended or reasonably likely to injure or kill not less than ten individuals.
§ 16-4-10 (a)(2)(A)	Domestic terrorism intended to intimidate the civilian population of the state
§ 16-4-10 (a)(2)(B)	Domestic terrorism that is intended to alter, change, or coerce the policy of the government of this state or any of its political subdivisions by intimidation or coercion
§ 16-4-10 (a)(2)(C)	Domestic terrorism that is intended to affect the conduct of the government of this state by use of destructive devices, assassination, or kidnapping
§ 16-5-1 (a)	Malice Murder
§ 16-5-1 (c)	Felony Murder
§ 16-5-24 (c)	Aggravated battery (upon a peace officer)
§ 16-5-24 (e)(1)-(2)	Aggravated battery (upon a correctional officer)
§ 16-5-40 (a)	Kidnapping
§ 16-5-44.1 (b)	Hijacking a motor vehicle
§ 16-5-72 (a)	Reckless abandonment
§ 16-6-1 (a)	Rape
§ 16-6-2 (b)(2)	Aggravated sodomy
§ 16-6-3 (a)	Statutory rape (when person convicted is 21 years of age or older)
§ 16-6-4 (b)(1)	Child molestation, (2 nd conviction)
§ 16-6-4 (c)	Aggravated child molestation
§ 16-6-22.2 (b)	Aggravated sexual battery
§ 16-7-88 (a)	Possessing, transporting, or receiving or intent to possess, transport, or receive explosives or destructive devices with knowledge or intent that they will be used to kill, injure, or intimidate individuals or destroy public buildings
§ 16-7-88 (b)	Use or attempt to use any destructive device or explosive to kill or injure any individual
§ 16-8-41 (a)	Armed Robbery, Robbery by Intimidation
§ 16-8-41 (c)(1)-(2)	Taking controlled substance from pharmacy in course of committing offense
§ 16-10-32 (a)	Attempted murder of witnesses in official proceedings
§ 16-10-32 (b)	Threatening or causing physical or economic harm of witnesses in official proceedings
§ 16-11-1 (a)	Treason
§ 16-13-30 (b)	Purchase, possession, manufacture, distribution, or sale of any controlled substance (with respect to flunitrazepam, a class IV controlled substance, second conviction)
§ 16-13-31 (a)	Trafficking in cocaine
§ 16-13-31 (b)(2)	Trafficking in illegal drugs (quantity of more than 14 grams, but less than 28 grams)
§ 16-13-31 (b)(3)	Trafficking in illegal drugs (quantity of more than 28 grams)
§ 16-13-31 (c)(3)	Trafficking in marijuana (quantity of 10,000 pounds or more)
§ 16-13-31 (d)(2)	Trafficking in methaqualone (quantity of 400 grams or more)

- § 16-13-31 (e) Knowingly selling, delivering, or bringing into this state 28 grams or more of methamphetamine, amphetamine, or any mixture containing methamphetamine or amphetamine
- § 16-13-31 (f) Manufacturing methamphetamine, amphetamine, or any mixture containing either methamphetamine or amphetamine
- § 16-13-31.1 (3) Penalty for selling, possessing, distributing or other offenses associated with ecstasy (400 grams or more)

Felonies – a felony docket consists of any charge(s) with a mandatory minimum sentence of one year or more. *A case filed with one felony charge and multiple misdemeanor charges should only be counted as (1) felony docket.*

Misdemeanors – reported when a misdemeanor is the most serious charge in the case.

Probation Revocations (if available) Chief Probation Officers and Private Probation Companies will also be asked to report any felony and misdemeanor probation revocation petitions.
